The ISSCT X Entomology Workshop will be hosted by the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences Everglades Research and Education Center (UF/IFAS EREC), Belle Glade, Florida, USA from 3 to 7 December 2018.

### **Programme**

Sunday 2 December 2018: Registration and Evening Welcome Reception

**Monday 3 December 2018:** Opening session and Keynote address, Oral presentations and discussion

**Tuesday 4 December 2018:** Oral presentations and discussion, Poster presentations **Wednesday 5 December 2018:** Full-day tour of the UF/IFAS EREC and field visits in the Everglades Agricultural Area

Thursday 6 December 2018: Oral presentations and discussion

Friday 7 December 7 2018: Half-day wrap-up session

Topics of sessions will include biological control, host plant resistance and plant-arthropod interactions, cultural practices and landscape management, biotechnologies and insecticides, invasive species monitoring and management, and climate change and international collaborations.



The Workshop will be conducted near the Everglades Agricultural Area in southern Florida, where sugar cane is the dominant crop. Approximately 160,000 ha are dedicated to sugar cane production in the area, with 80% of the acreage being on organic (muck) soils and the remaining 20% being on mineral (sandy) soils. Each growing season, 13-15 million metric tons are harvested and the production is crushed at four sugar mills. Rice, sweet corn, and leafy and brassica vegetables are also grown in the Everglades Agricultural Area.

#### Language

The Workshop will be conducted in English.

#### **Abstract submission**

Authors must submit an abstract for each presentation, oral or poster, they intend to make during the Workshop. Please send each submission as a single MS Word file to Section Chair François-Régis Goebel at <a href="mailto:regis.goebel@cirad.fr">regis.goebel@cirad.fr</a>. Abstracts should be submitted as soon as possible but not after 1 July 2018. Each submission should include:

**Presentation format:** Select oral or poster presentation.

**Section:** Indicate which Workshop session would best fit the submission (biological control, host plant resistance and plant-arthropod interactions, agricultural practices and landscape management, biotechnologies and insecticides, invasive species monitoring and management, or climate change and international collaborations).

#### Title

**Author(s):** Include the name, affiliation, physical address, and e-mail address for each author. The name of the presenting author should be underlined.

**Abstract:** Include an outline of the presentation ( $\leq$  300 words). The abstract should include information on why the study was conducted ( $\leq$  2 sentences), how the study was conducted ( $\leq$  4 sentences), the results ( $\leq$  6 sentences), and the conclusions from the study ( $\leq$  4 sentences).

1 July 2018: Deadline for abstract submission (oral presentations and posters)

**30 July 2018:** Notification of acceptance of oral presentations and posters from Organizing Committee

13 August 2018: Deadline for Workshop registration

# Passport and visa requirements

Non-US citizens must possess a passport valid for at least six months beyond the period of stay in the US.
